

Monday Apr 08






On April 8, there was a total eclipse visible from a big part of the American continent. From PROBA2, the eclipse was only partial. However, the spacecraft was crossing twice the eclipse zone: around 16:50 and 20:50 UT. LYRA curves show the irradiance drop caused by the occultation of the Sun by the Moon in each of its channels.


The strongest flare of this week is a M5.4. The source of the flare was just behind the Sun's northeastern limb.
